

# Thirteen TBR colleges offer workforce-ready programs in Early Childhood Education.





Associate of Applied Science

**NINE** community colleges offer associate of applied science degree programs in early childhood education.

These programs require approximately 60 credit hours to complete.



Long-Term Technical Certificate

**TEN** community colleges offer long-term technical certificates in early childhood education.

These programs require approximately 24 credit hours to complete.



Short-Term Technical Certificate

THREE community colleges offer short-term technical certificates in early childhood education.

These programs require approximately 12 credit hours to complete.



TCAT Diploma


**ONE** Tennessee College of Applied Technology (TCAT Nashville) offers a diploma in early childhood education.

This program requires approximately one year (1,296 clock hours) to complete.

\*Note: The associate degree program at Motlow State Community College is not included in the counts of programs above, as it will be phased out in 2023. Associate degree programs were also phased out at Columbia State (in 2018) and Volunteer State (in 2020).



## More than 600 students are enrolled in Early Childhood Education programs.





As of fall 2022, 633 students were enrolled in early childhood education programs at community colleges & TCATs.


Enrollment in these programs has declined slightly over time.


### Declines in early childhood programs have outpaced broader declines at community colleges.



From fall 2019 to 2022, overall community college enrollment in TN declined 19%.



From fall 2019 to 2022, enrollment in early childhood programs declined 28%.



### Most early childhood education students are female, and many are over age 25.



97% of students were female.

99% of credentials were earned by female students.

33% of students were Black or Hispanic.

23% of credentials were earned by Black and Hispanic students.

53% of students were age 25 or older.

74% of credentials were earned by adult students age 25+.



### The number of graduates in early childhood education programs fell in 2021-22.




In the 2021-2022 academic year, students earned 231 diplomas, certificates, and associate degrees in early childhood education.

### Student Success in Early Childhood Education Programs





On average, graduates took 3.3 years to complete associate degrees in early childhood education



In fall 2019, there were 247 first-time students enrolled in early childhood education programs at community colleges. Of these students, **17% graduated within three years**, 10% were still enrolled at a community college after three years, and 3% had transferred to a non-TBR college.



Tennessee Transfer Pathway (TTP) programs are designed to transfer to a four-year university.


## Ten TBR colleges offer programs designed to transfer to a university in Early Childhood Education.





#### 890 students are enrolled in transfer programs in early childhood & elementary education.






In fall 2022, 969 students were enrolled in early childhood and elementary education transfer pathways.

### The number of graduates from early childhood transfer pathways has increased.



In the 2021-2022
academic year,
students earned
138 associate degrees
in early childhood
transfer pathways.



## However, only one in three students in these transfer pathways ultimately transferred to a university.

Among students who enrolled in early childhood education transfer programs, one in three (32%) transferred to a university within three years of enrolling at a community college.

However, transfer rates are much higher for students who graduated from a community college TTP program. Transfer rates in early childhood TTP programs are higher than transfer rates generally for TTP students.
